Course Description

Surveys the major periods of visual arts in the West, with a focus on the Middle Ages and the Renaissance. Introduces students to the concepts of art and surveys the development of art in historical context from the Early Middle Ages through the Late Renaissance. Emphasizes selected works of painting, sculpture, architecture, and other arts studied in relation to the cultures producing them.

- 1. Identify and discuss major works of art and architecture from the Early Middle Ages through the Late Renaissance.
- 2. Utilize vocabulary and language of the visual arts.
- 3. Discuss the relationships between art and society within their historical, social, cultural, and philosophical contexts.
- 4. Identify the methods, techniques, and materials used by Medieval and Renaissance artists to create their work.
- 5. Examine and summarize important Medieval and Renaissance artistic contributions to the evolution of Western art and culture.
