Course Description

Builds on drawing fundamentals from ART 131. Introduces use of color in drawings. Create and analyze projects that demonstrate critical and creative thinking. Demonstrate individual exploration of process and content. May be repeated for credit.

2. Analyze drawn artworks in a variety of historical styles.
3. Contextualize self-created artwork within drawing's historical and cultural traditions.
4. Use media-specific terminology to receive and provide feedback.

2. Drawing materials: papers, pastels, colored pencils, charcoals and graphite
3. Advanced drawing techniques: contour, tonal, and perspective
4. Expressive and personal style
5. Historical art styles
