### **Course Description**

Prepares students for instruction: planning, using a variety of instructional methods, teaching diverse learners, and evaluating course outcomes. Includes guidelines for addressing the critical issues of safety and the legal issues of training. This course is articulated with DPSST to provide NFPA Instructor 1 Certification. P/NP grading.

6. Deliver a presentation from notes and from an organization's already prepared instructor guide or lesson plan and participate in a critique.7. Discuss methods of planning instructional delivery which includes methods of managing learner behavior, preparation steps for teaching, and maintaining lesson continuity.

8. Explain the purpose of testing and evaluation and describe the steps to take and methods to consider when planning, developing, and assessing testing and evaluation instruments.
