Explore and understand the diverse natural and cultural landscapes of Central Oregon. Travel to locales across the region by van during five full days in this field-based course.

- 3. Compare how government and non-governmental organizations manage areas for which they are responsible.
- 4. Give reasons for how the distribution of cultural elements of the area have been influenced by physical geography.
