Course Description

Covers the intellectual, political and cultural history of 20th century European history. Interprets society, culture, and writings from Europe and the colonies, analyzing the historical setting and significance of major occurrences in Europe, such as imperialism, fascism, world wars, the Holocaust, Soviet communism, and decolonization. Does not need to be taken in sequence.

1. Interpret the relationship between the past and the present, taking into account twentieth century European social, cultural, political, and religious perspectives.

2. Interpret art and film from Europe's twentieth century.

3. Use evidence from primary and secondary sources to understand and describe events, issues, developments, relationships, and perspectives within Europe and European colonies.

4. Critique, in the context of twentieth century European history, shared assumptions and cultural stereotypes through written and oral discussion.
